

She may take the exterior structure of a plant and blend it with a molecular-type pattern to form a vibrant image that may seem abstract to the casual viewer, but is anything but.

"I think of them sort of as landscapes and all the imagery comes from somewhere. They're hybrids in a way. It could be part of a cell, plant or rock formation all put together," she said. "I pick from certain systems that are biological, anatomical, cultural, architectural and celestial. So it goes from the micro to the macro so that there's these

different landscapes of our existence from our cells to the great landscape of the great plains or a rainforest or space."

At the East Lansing Arts Festival, the Lansing resident plans to bring about 60 to 70 of her paintings – encompassing about two years of work.

Robbins earned her master's degree in painting from Michigan State University after graduating from the University of Kentucky with a bachelor's in painting.

She's shown her work around the Midwest and received a grant from MSU's College of Arts and Letters to study in Tokyo, Japan.

She likes to use acrylic in her work because it dries quickly but also works with cloth, lace and string in her work. Robbins said she finds inspiration in almost everything.

"I don't paint every single thing I see, but I'm inspired by rain, bubbles in the soda and everything," she said.
